Good afternoon. I hope everyone had a great Christmas.

I think we had a good meeting with Nevada SUD last week. The SUD has proposed two possible locations for the WWTP (System Map CR 1040 attached). Both are southeast of town and would discharge into Bois d Arc Creek or a major tributary. If you look at the attached "Potential WWTP Locations Map" that I created a few weeks ago you will see that over 3,000-acres would gravity drain to either location proposed by the SUD. Of course, much of this acreage will see residential development and based on my conversations with you guys, the City is really only interested in providing capacity to the proposed WWTP to commercial development. Residential development would still be required to have OSSF. Doing this keeps the density of residential development to a half-acre minimum. Moving forward under that assumption, of the over 3,000 acres, approximately 400 acres have a future land use designation of commercial (this excludes the school). At this preliminary planning stage, I think it would be wise to tack on another 100 to 200 acres as large residential development may find it desirable to mix in some commercial components.

Therefore, assuming 600 acres of future commercial development at 1,500 gallons per acre per day (gpad) (based City of McKinney Design Manual) results in a required capacity of 900,000 gallons per day (gpd). That is a significant amount of wastewater flow. Of course, the 1,500 gpad from McKinney's Design Manual assumes dense commercial development. At this stage, I believe it is safe to assume that commercial development in Nevada will not be as dense as it is in McKinney. With that in mind, I believe a more realistic assumption for wastewater flows would be 750 to 1,000 gpad. This results in a required capacity of 450,000 to 600,000 gpd. Based on all of this, I would recommend requesting an **ultimate capacity of 600,000 gpd**. Please keep in mind, these are preliminary numbers looking to full buildout 30+ years down the road. Unfortunately, I do not have a crystal ball so the required capacity we provide the SUD today should be routinely reevaluated (at least once every five years) to ensure we are accurately tracking the City's needs as it grows.

Earlier this year we did a similar exercise (see attached emails) for the Stinebaugh Development (50-acres) and settled on 75,000 gpd for the Stinebaughs and another 75,000 gpd for near term (next 5 to 10 years) commercial development. As it was then and still is now, without knowing what exactly the commercial development will look like (e.g. restaurants, offices, storage, outlets, box stores, mixed use), one must make some broad assumptions which will ideally result in a high flow rate estimate.

I believe Nevada should request 150,000 gpd with the first phase of the WWTP. This will cover the Stinebaugh Development and other near term future commercial development. As the WWTP

expands and the City grows, we will have to evaluate how much additional capacity is needed and when. When considering ultimate development (30+ years down the road), it is my recommendation that the City request capacity for 600,000 gpd.

Please note that these calculations are preliminary and high level in nature. Without knowing specifics on the type and density of future commercial development, it is difficult to accurately calculate the wastewater flows. I believe I have made conservative assumptions; however, the anticipated wastewater flows should be routinely reevaluated (at least once every 5 years if not more frequently as development demands it) to ensure we are providing the SUD with as accurate an estimate as possible as we move forward.

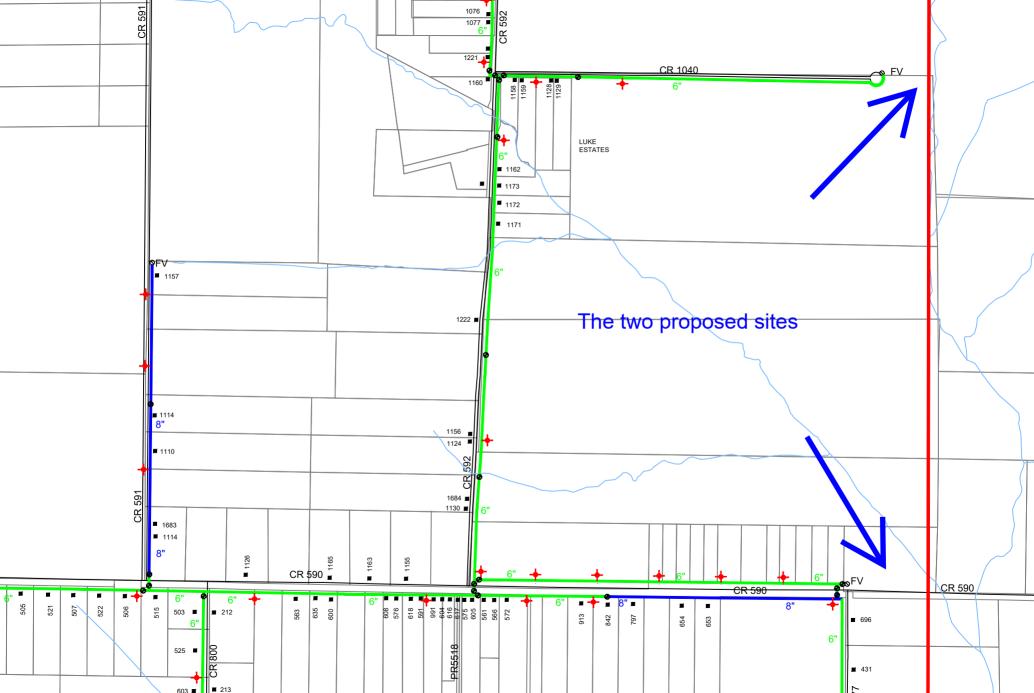

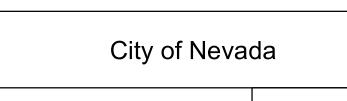




Potential WWTP Locations







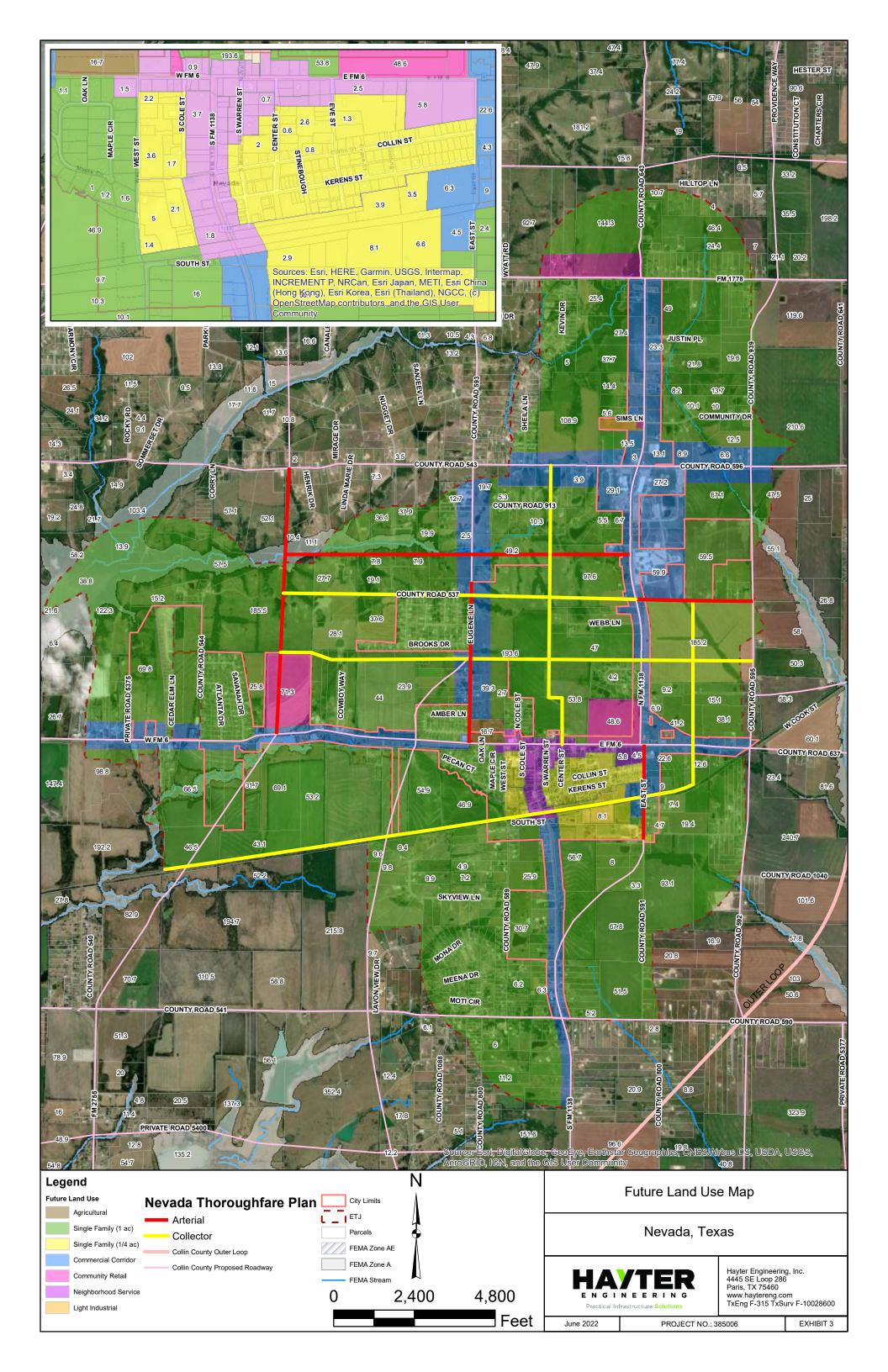
